

FENOZ 1.5.0 - WHAT'S NEW

April 2026

Fenoz 1.5.0 is a major update that introduces a new Reporting module, a new Licensing model, improvements to case management, a redesigned Case List View, and a broad set of usability and performance enhancements across the platform.

Highlights

- Create professional reports directly in Fenoz with support for HTML and DOCX output, report previewing, metadata editing, branding and layout settings, and background processing so you can continue working while reports are generated.
- Manage licenses more easily with support for license generation, upload and renewal, user limit enforcement, expiry warnings, and a dedicated license information dashboard.
- Work more efficiently with the redesigned Case List View, which now includes a cleaner layout, breadcrumb navigation, standardised actions, and improved consistency across the interface.
- Benefit from broader usability improvements across the platform, including a new Light theme, improved login and evidence screens, better menu structure, and faster file browsing through pagination.
- Gain more visibility into processing activity with improved notifications and real-time progression tracking for cases, evidences, and media types.

NEW FEATURES

Reporting

Fenoz 1.5.0 introduces a fully integrated reporting module that allows investigators and case managers to generate structured, branded reports directly from the platform. Users can preview report content, edit report metadata, finalise reports, and download completed files in HTML or DOCX format. Report generation runs in the background and progress is shown through the notification bell, allowing users to continue working while reports are processed. Older reports are also cleaned up automatically to help manage storage.

Global Settings

Administrators can now configure organisation-specific branding, including logos and colour schemes, through the new branding settings capability. Fenoz also

now includes a Light theme alongside the existing dark mode, giving users more flexibility in how they work.

Redesigned Case List View

The Case List View has been rebuilt with a more modern and consistent design. Improvements include a top navigation bar, breadcrumb navigation, clearer action buttons, a case data grid, a kebab menu for common actions such as delete, open and edit, and additional refinements to fonts, toast messages and background colour usage.

Licensing

Fenoz now includes a complete licensing model with support for generating, uploading and renewing license files. The platform can enforce concurrent user limits, track active sessions, notify users ahead of license expiry, and apply a configurable goodwill period before access is blocked. Administrators can manage license details through a dedicated dashboard, while regular users can view a simplified license status.

Notifications

A new notification manager improves how Fenoz handles alerts and long-running actions. Users now receive progress and completion notifications for background tasks such as report generation or evidence processing, helping teams stay informed while work continues in the background.

Hash Library Enhancements

The Hash Library has been enhanced with a refreshed interface aligned to the Fenoz design system. Users can access quick actions such as viewing details, editing, exporting and deleting entries, while export support now includes CSV and Encase formats. Label and memo management has also been added directly in the library.

IMPROVEMENTS

Better User Experience Across the Platform

A wide range of UI and UX improvements have been made throughout Fenoz. These include reworked menus and sub-menus, improved add-evidence screens, a redesigned login page, licensing UI refinements, a colour picker for classifications, and pagination in the file browser to improve performance when working with large evidence sets. Autoresync has also been added to the add-evidence flow.

Stronger Case Management

Case management has been enhanced with support for case export, improved classification management, native support for disk image evidence, better visibility of evidence progress in list views, and validation to block unsupported evidence formats before processing begins.

User Management Improvements

Users can now reset their passwords through a self-service flow, reducing the need for administrator intervention. Password resets can now be done by the user, forgotten passwords still need the administrator to create a new password. Automatic logout has also been added for both Fenoz and Aviator sessions to improve session security.

Expanded Audit Trail

The audit trail has been extended to capture more user activity. Infrastructure for storing and handling audit messages is now in place, and login actions are already recorded, supporting stronger traceability for key investigative workflows. The audit logs are now queryable from within Fenoz.

Real-Time Progress Tracking

The Progression Manager provides real-time visibility into processing progress across cases, evidences, media types and video files. This helps users monitor long-running operations more easily and improves visibility into ongoing system activity.

BUG FIXES AND STABILITY IMPROVEMENTS

Fenoz 1.5.0 also includes a broad set of fixes and stability improvements, including:

- Fixes for case creation and classification editing.
- Improvements to permissions handling, including corrections to group permissions and add-evidence permissions.
- Resolved issues in the add-evidence flow, including path inconsistencies and evidence not appearing in the grid after being added.
- Fixes for classification display and refresh issues.
- Improvements to global settings behaviour, including corrections to the save button state.
- Fixes for login issues such as a 403 error when signing in with another user.
- Corrections to daily hash list image display and other usability issues in case workflows.
